**PROGRAM AND OUTCOMES MEETING MINUTES
AUGUST 14, 2017**

1. CALL TO ORDER

Leanne Eby called the meeting to order at 5:50 p.m. A quorum was present.

2. OLD BUSINESS

Website Update: We have received a signed contract with Julie Martini. She has started putting together frames for us to review and we will be meeting with her soon.

Strategic Plan Update: This report is for FY 17-19. Clemons went over some items that are in progress. Some items included:

- The Wood County ADAMHS Board is reaching out to businesses in Wood County.
- Working with agencies on Intervention Crisis response procedures.
- Meeting with CRC in the next coming weeks on crisis response.
- We have heard that some referral sources are not aware of the continuum of services for those suffering from opiate abuse. To address this, Board staff and the PR committee are working to provide more thorough education. Clemons has met with the Wood County Commissioners and social workers from Job and Family Services to inform them of resources. Clemons will be providing similar education this week at Wood County's Family and Children's First Council meeting and will expand outreach in the county in numerous ways. Clemons also noted we are reaching out to the faith based communities and businesses.
- Director Clemons mentioned there is some money for county-wide training in the evidence based program Dialectic Behavioral Therapy (DBT), we are looking into partners to provide comprehensive training. The cost of ten large teams would be about \$170,000. We may be

looking at a scaled down version of the training. Clemons will send the link to everyone explaining what DBT is being used for right now.

- The Behavioral Health redesign got pushed back until January. We delayed the implementation of non-Medicaid service codes until January as well, at the urgent request of the Board's contract agencies. The Executive Committee approved FY18 amendment of agency contracts which included language implementing Behavioral Health and services codes. Implementation of the GOSH claims payment system is going well. Medicaid managed care is still scheduled to occur January 1, 2018, at this time. We are addressing needs for women's recovery housing. Zepf has been looking at a specific property. Clemons will keep everyone updated as things occur.

3. NEW BUSINESS

Suicide Stats- Chris Streidl shared data on suicides in Wood County. The Board receives death certificates from the Wood County Coroner Office. Board staff then logs the information into a system which then produces this information. We have data from 1999-present. We have passed the national suicide rate back in 2014-2015. The national rates have increased and we are above the national average. This is most likely a low estimate. Perrysburg has the most suicides reported of all towns in Wood County. Streidl broke reports by seasons, time of day, method, ages, gender, race, and veterans. We can't figure out how to track if the person is LGBTQ status or transgender or if the person was in treatment or not. A member suggested we be careful when presenting information regarding firearms since we draw monies from federal. He believes there are laws on if talking about if firearms are used in suicide and presenting such in an education setting. Clemons will check into this matter to get clarification.

Opiate Epidemic Response- Clemons shared what the Board is doing in terms of Prevention/Education, Intervention, Treatment and Recovery system wide with the Wood County Commissioners. We are doing a lot in Wood County for the opiate epidemic, but more is planned and more yet to be done. Please see the attached document.

Youth Hospitalization Capacity Expansion Report- Clemons the lack of psychiatric hospital beds available for youth in Ohio, and that this is especially true for youth who are aggressive. Clemons is working with other regional Board executive directors, University of Toledo Medical Center (UTMC) management and their Department of Psychiatry to explore developing psychiatric units to address these needs. Progress is being made but more information will be coming soon.


Outcomes and System of Care Report- Please see attached report. This is the fourth quarter from last year. Streidl has received some numbers for this year, already. It was recommended to put an asterisk near un duplicated or duplicated client totals. Streidl walked the committee through the data collected. PR information was not included since PR is presenting to the Board this month. MyOutcomes data was promising but also a concern to Streidl. We were unable to see the impact on canceled appointments since no one is entering the data. We need better compliance on this from all of our agencies. This year all Wood County residents receiving services will need to be put into

MyOutcomes. The average number of sessions were 3.66 for children and for adults the average was 2.81, with 80 % of clients receiving less than five sessions. We hope to be able to track missed and canceled appointments moving forward.
