CALL TO ORDER: Jessica Clements called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM.

NEW BUSINESS:

H.O.P.E. Program (Fostoria) Presentation: Julie Reinhart and Autumn Clouse presented on H.O.P.E Program. Julie provided an overview of past programs and the program priorities and goals for 2020. Please see the attached presentation.

AOT: Chris Streidl reported Assisted Outpatient Treatment (AOT) is a program that is growing across the state, and we see the need. We have been working with the Probate Court. We are not quite ready to bring a proposal to you, but we wanted to carve out some funds in the system of care budget for later. We would then ask for proposals from agencies for Board vote.

Allocations Update: We have been meeting with agencies discussing proposals getting questions on unclear items. Executive Director recommendations will be coming soon. We are looking to bring these to committees in September.

Suicide Prevention Program: Three presentations tonight.

CRC Proposal Presentation: Noelle Duvall presented their PowerPoint presentation, which you can see attached. Noelle reviewed the current program CRC uses, which is an evidence-based program to meet the needs of youth of all ages. Noelle indicated that with expanded funding, they would like to add a program for students that have been identified as at-risk in middle and high school, which can be provided in person or remotely (on-line).

ESC Proposal Presentation: Kyle Clark and Angela Patchen presented, presentation attached. This proposal consists of two programs: Lifelines for 6th through 9th grades, four 45 minute sessions; Teen Mental Health First Aid is five 45 minute sessions, 10th, and 11th grade, the target number would be 3900 students. 3 grades in each district, plus one grade at Penta. The total request is \$71,309. The referral source would be school counselors, and the focus is on prevention and not treatment.


Unison Proposal Presentation: Amanda Kern presented Unison's plan, presentation attached. This plan would start at grade 5-12. The plan would be to work with the schools and community the first year and to start working with the student's next fall (2021).

Outcomes Report: Chris Streidl shared Quarter Four Outcomes Report. Please see attached. Quarter 4 is not accurate because of timing to get bills in and those bills to roll down to us from insurance and other payers, also due to COVID 19 pandemic. If this is all we get from the agencies, they took a significant hit. We expect these to come up a little. We cannot quantify this yet; we will as time goes on. ARC will be coming in September to present. Cocoon we need to monitor what they provide, ESC they do outcomes once a year and will get this to you as soon as we get them. NAMI's outcomes will be separate once or twice a year. Pathstone we didn't get anything from them. Looking at a new vendor .

Crisis Stabilization Funds: We received some funds and we will discuss this more at a future meeting. \$70,000 a year for two years. Not enough to build a crisis stabilization unit but more to come.
