SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF OPIOID ABUSE

Appearance

Unexplained weight loss
Drooping eyelids (appear drowsy)
Sleeping a lot
"Pinpoint pupils"
Itching
Poor hygiene

Personality

Socially withdrawn from friends and family
Change in social group that does not make sense
Change in attitude
Paranoia
Increase secrecy
Unable to concentrate
Not keeping commitments, breaking promises
Missing work
Low energy, lack of energy
Low motivation

Withdrawal Symptoms

Sweating
Restlessness
Bone or joint aches
Runny nose or tearing
Cramps, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea
Increase heart rate
Tremor/muscle twitching
Yawning
Anxiety or irritability
Gooseflesh skin

Other Signs

Presence of hypodermic needles
Missing spoons
Lighters present
Missing money
Unknown credit card charges
Windows open despite heating/air conditioning
Blankets or towels at bottom of room door
Friends visiting at strange hours

Wood County Hospital has partnered with New Vision to provide a medical withdrawal management services for those with pending or active withdrawal from alcohol, prescription medications and other drugs. Patients are admitted to WCH for a short stay (typically 3-5 days) while our physicians and nurses treat them. New Vision staff at the hospital work with patients to create a discharge plan, connecting patients with continued care within a recovery program. Through this program, withdrawal is medically managed by a team of the hospital's doctors and nurses. Most commercial insurance plans, Medicare and certain Medicaid plans are accepted.

ADA-accessible non-emergency transportation to medical, dental, vision, pharmacy, mental health, and addiction treatment appointments/services. Transportation is not provided to free services such as health fairs, support groups, meetings with social service organizations, informational sessions, etc. Transportation cannot be provided at this time to the grocery store or other shopping, trips to the laundromat, or to employment or schooling.
