

The Wood County Opiate task force provided leadership in the early years of the opiate epidemic and brought together treatment professionals and community experts to develop new strategies and share resources. Like many Opiate task forces throughout the state, our task force has evolved and is now the Addiction Task Force, and works collaboratively with the Wood County Prevention Coalition. The task force serves as the Opiate hub under Ohio statute. Meetings are held at the Educational Resource Center quarterly and host a variety of informative and educational topics. The task force also hosts events such as drug take-back day.

The Wood County Addiction Response Collaborative (ARC) is a program designed to assist individuals who have experienced opioid overdoses, substance abuse addictions, and families to create a bridge to recovery programs and resources. We work with many different treatment providers in our area, as well as throughout the State of Ohio to tailor the recovery program to what would best serve you or your loved one. We work diligently in service of the client, and will handle the sometimes daunting challenges faced with addiction, whether that be insurance or Medicaid issues, transportation, employment, and housing.

The Children's Resource Center has provided behavioral health services to the youth and families of Wood County since 1976, serving over 1,600 youth annually. Our mission is to provide child-centered, family-focused mental health and co-occurring mental health and substance abuse services to all Wood County and nearby families. We strive to provide collaborative, compassionate, affordable treatment to maximize every child's safety and future happiness.

The need for youth behavioral health services continues to rise, with 1 in 7 adolescents experiencing a mental disorder globally, according to the World Health Organization. We see evidence of data like this in our own community as well, with the number of teens reporting a moderate, severe, or intense mental health issue significantly increasing in 2022 according to the Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services Board Youth Survey conducted for Wood County. The Children's Resource Center continues to address these rising concerns by providing a full spectrum of trauma-informed mental health and co-occurring mental health/substance abuse treatment and prevention services. We serve individuals from birth to 18 years of age, seriously emotionally disturbed children up to 21 in selected programs, and youth and young adults in transition up to age 24. Through an expansive range of behavioral health services, we help youth develop hope, build resilience, and discover joy in life once again.





The Cocoon is Wood County's comprehensive domestic and sexual violence agency providing shelter and advocacy services to survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, sexual harassment, sex trafficking, stalking, and adult survivors of childhood sexual abuse.

The Cocoon serves women, men, and their children and is one of the few agencies of its kind in the country to be able to house family pets. Programs and services are provided at no cost to survivors and their families throughout their lifetimes.



The Community Learning Centers of Wood County Educational Service Center provide quality enrichment and extended learning activities for elementary children – kindergarten through sixth grades. Daily Before–school, After–school, and Summer STARS program meets the care and supervision needs of parents during out–of–school hours while engaging children in fun learning experiences that complement their school–day instruction.

The Wood County Educational Service Center's school and community based Prevention Education Program uses evidence-based programs in the classroom.

Harbor serves over 24,000 youth, adults, seniors and families annually and provides a full range of mental health, telehealth, and substance use disorder treatment services. Harbor is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) and certified by the Ohio Mental Health & Addiction Services (OhioMHAS).

National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) Wood County is a leading self-help organization offering free events, educational classes, support groups, and other programs that address mental health for the Wood County community. NAMI Wood County has a variety of programming throughout the year! This programming is FREE and available to all Wood County residents. NAMI Wood County will be hosting their Peer-to-Peer, Family-to-Family, and Wellness Recovery Action Plan (WRAP) classes in 2024. If you are an individual living with a mental health condition, consider attending their Peer-to-Peer and/or WRAP class:

- NAMI Peer-to-Peer is an educational course for individuals living with a mental illness. NAMI Wood County will be hosting their next class starting Wednesday, April 3rd from 5:30-7:30p.m. at the NAMI Wood County office. Visit https://namiwoodcounty.org/peer-peer/ to register for this FREE class.
 The Wellness Recovery Action Plan (WRAP) Workshop is a free of charge, self-designed, course on identifying your personal wellness tools. The next WRAP workshop takes place on February 27th, 28th, 29th, and March 1st from 2:00-4:00p.m. gt the NAMI Wood County.org/wrap/ to register for this FREE class.

NAMI Wood County also offers their **NAMI Connection Recovery Support Group every Wednesday from 12:00-1:30p.m.** at the NAMI Wood County office. This recovery support group is for adults living with mental illness, and provides respect, understanding, encouragement, and hope while facilitated by individuals with lived experience, meaning they too live with a mental health condition. No registration required for this FREE group. Visit https://namiwoodcounty.org/nami-connection-recovery-support-group/ to learn more.

Do you have an adult child, adolescent, sibling, parent or loved one in your life who lives with a mental health condition? NAMI Wood County believes it is important to care for the caregiver through evidence-based family and caregiver programming. This spring, NAMI Wood County will be hosting **NAMI Family-to-Family**, an educational course for family, caregivers, and friends of individuals living with a mental illness. This class will be starting on **Thursday, April 4th from 6:00-8:30p.m.** at the NAMI Wood County office. Visit https://namiwoodcounty.org/family-family/ to register for this FREE class.

Additionally, NAMI Wood County's Family and Caregiver support group is available for individuals who have family members, children, and/or loved ones in their lives who live with a mental health condition. This support group is a peer-led support group with facilitators who also have loved ones in their lives living with mental health conditions. **This FREE group meets the first and third Tuesday of the month from 3:00 – 4:30p.m.** at the NAMI Wood County office.

If you are interested in volunteering at NAMI Wood County, there are opportunities to get involved as a support group or class facilitator, office volunteer, and more, including "Chip-In Days," volunteer opportunities for all community members. Hosted on the second Tuesday of each month from 11:00AM-3:00PM, volunteers will be able to assist NAMI Wood County staff in various projects throughout the office including (but not limited to) folding brochures, helping with mailings, office organizing, and more. With compassion and respect, OhioGuidestone helps people across the lifespan navigate the most difficult times of their lives. As the state's leader in community behavioral health care, we focus on the needs of the whole person, empowering them to take steps towards a healthier future. OhioGuidestone provides mental health and substance use treatment, focusing on responsive person-centered care. Our services are available in various settings to expand access to care, including the home, community, office, and through telehealth, catering to youth, adults, and families. Outpatient services can include, but are not limited to individual, family and group counseling, case management, peer support, relational skill building for parenting success, mental health psychiatry and Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT). OhioGuidestone's comprehensive Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT) program includes individual psychotherapy, skills groups and skills coaching to individuals and families focusing on difficult-to-treat problems when traditional therapies have been unsuccessful in making progress. At OhioGuidestone we believe in creating lasting,

productive solutions. Our criminal justice programs provide screening and support to incarcerated individuals for any potential behavioral health needs. These services are provided with the partnership of the Wood County Justice Center. Individuals receive screening upon entry to the jail to determine if they have any need for behavioral health treatment. If appropriate, individuals are referred for supportive services, including linkage to treatment, coordination with other involved systems, diagnostic assessment, group therapy and re-entry planning. Individuals are also assessed to see if they would benefit from Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) for alcohol or opiate use, before release from incarceration as part of OhioGuidestone's Project Direct Link Program. These services help develop an action plan to encourage sustained change empowering individuals to take steps towards a healthier future.

Since our start, OhioGuidestone has been devoted to helping those in need by providing services to meet the challenges of the day on the cutting edge of mental health. Each day we use innovation, applied science, and community-based research to expand pathways for success. The Center for FASD at OhioGuidestone is one of the nation's oldest diagnostic clinics for Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD). The Center for FASD offers assessment utilizing a multi-disciplinary approach of medical professionals. The Center for FASD offers counseling for children and caregivers, tools and techniques for those working with a child with a prenatal brain disorder and professional training and evidence-based curricula to help parents, teachers, social service providers and medical and allied health professionals to help children at every stage of their development.

As part of our mission to provide better access to care, OhioGuidestone offers quick, direct access to psychiatric providers through our Psychiatry First program. Psychiatry First engages patients' initial needs as quickly as possible, reducing wait times for appointments to see one of our psychiatric providers who can assess, diagnose and start treatment. Psychiatry First services offer a collaborative, personcentered approach to care to achieve patient goals. Medication is key in some areas of behavioral health. Symptom reduction through prescribed medication in conjunction with traditional therapy can increase the effectiveness of clinical services. OhioGuidestone's Rapid Access Program offers same-day, walk-in appointments with a prescriber for evaluation for Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT). Rapid Access is offered from 8:00am a.m. to 10:00 a.m. on Thursdays at our Wood County office, located at 885 Commerce Drive Perrysburg, OH 43551.

Unison Health integrates primary healthcare into their overall approach to treating addiction to opioids and other drugs, as well as behavioral health concerns. In addition, Unison Health offers proven, evidence-based programming designed to ensure each client receives the care he or she needs.

The Survivors of Suicide Support Group is tailored for those who have lost a loved one to suicide. Recognizing unique challenges, the group offers a safe, non-judgmental space to discuss experiences, fears, and emotions openly. The Survivors of Suicide Support Group breaks down barriers by fostering connections among individuals who share a common bond. Through shared experiences and understanding, participants find strength in knowing that others have walked a similar path.

Groups meet every 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month at 6 pm. The groups are located at Unison Health's 1084 S. Main Street office in Bowling Green, Ohio. All are welcome, and there is no charge, thanks to funding from the Wood County ADAMHS Board.



The Zepf Center operates a level three men's recovery house located in Cygnet, OH.

The residential sober living environment for individuals with a substance abuse problem, or who are in recovery. Recovery Housing focuses on strength-based approaches, 12 step facilitation, gender specific housing, cultural sensitivity and is welcoming of individuals with co-occurring conditions and/or on methadone.
